Sara Dziri

Black Hole is a music and dance performance by DJ and sound artist Sara Dziri, who, together with dancerchoreographer Yasmina Tayoub, explores the intersections of rave culture and North-African trance traditions. Drawing from Sara Dziri's research on trance practices in Egypt and Tunisia, the performance invites the audience into an imaginary rave space between dark escapism and otherworldly bliss. During a work visit to Cairo, Sara Dziri was inspired by the zār, an ancient trance-like healing ritual typically associated with women and outsider communities, who use ecstatic dancing to find solace, liberation and meaningful connection. She saw strong resemblances with rave culture: community, healing, and connection through dance and music, far from the eyes of societal and political condemnation. With Black Hole she wants to highlight rave culture and trance traditions as spaces of resistance and connection.

The Soft Layer Jozef Wouters

This performance is a continuation of *The Soft Layer* (Tunis), a site-specific project that took place from 2017 to 2019 in the historic Dar Bairam Turki building in the Medina of Tunis, as part of the *Dream City Biennial*.

Over the course of several years, artist and scenographer Jozef Wouters collected stories and ideas among the residents of Dar Bairam Turki. In the building's courtvard, a group was formed, consisting of young architects, neighbors, actors and a science fiction writer. Together, they began the 'renovation' of the beautiful Ottoman palace from the 17th century. This was no typical renovation: rather than remove layers, they added a new one, coating the building with a veneer of collective memories, stories and opinions. The text *The Soft Layer* was part of this project. It was recited at sunset, as an act of caring and a collective reflection on the building. During MolenFest 2024, Jozef Wouters revisits the space from Tunis in the courtyard of the new Decorateliersite in the Rue de Courtrai. Decoratelier's builders will create a blueprint of Dar Bairam Turki so that four actors from Brussels can re-enact The Soft Layer, conjuring the original building.

It questions the commons and their rough edges, urbanity and rurality, landscape and intimacy.

This year Feral explores contemporary rituals as levers of collective power. How do rituals and art affect each other? Why do we need formats that bring us together in new and different ways? What does this say about our society, its fears and its mobilization? And if we had to invent an artistic ritual for the city, what would it be?

Juliette Chevalier / La Drache

March 2020. With covid looming large, the world goes into lockdown. Choreographer Juliette Chevalier has just returned from the popular Dunkirk Carnival. There is contrast, rupture, stupor. But also a momentum, as the crisis becomes the driving force behind her research into the power and resilience of the human body, the desire for dance and touch, or our ability to see intense colors in the depths of winter. The Dunkirk Festival is known to unite all walks of life. But is has also come under scrutiny for certain sexist and racist transgressions.

From the ruckus, Juliette Chevalier and her company La Drache emerge as a rowdy gang of merrymakers who use rigadoon dancing and Ch'ti folklore to escape the prevailing norms, reclaim their own dreamscapes and unite as one. With a headdress of flowers, the gender-neutral figure of *Beste Cantate* conjures a whimsical, multicolored group from her imagination, heading for a pagan queer festival.

Not Your Techno is a party concept, a community and a platform that promotes diverse and upcoming talent in electronic music. Focusing on female-identifying, queer and POC artists, it aims to create events where people can be themselves, feel safe and share their passion for music.

Samar epitomizes experimental music, jungle rhythms and alternative electronics, from visceral ambient to heart-stopping percussion.

Cheb Runner is a musical hurricane rooted in Moroccan soil and exploring multiple musical landscapes.

The script is not set in stone and gives you the opportunity to voice your own ideas about democracy and society. The Museum of Innocence

Lisa Matthys

What do children see when they hear the word 'museum'? What do concepts like art, collection and beauty mean to them? Lisa Matthys put these questions to the pupils of De Droomboom Elementary School in Laeken. The outcome of this participatory project builds towards a collection: not a physical collection, but a collection you can experience through a soundscape of children's voices. The multi-speaker installation, which was created with sound artist Arno Boey, is an integral part of the tour. It quite literally lets you hear how kids from Brussels envision their future, imaginary museum. The soundscape mingles voices, sounds, noises and wishes as they point towards a chalk floor plan outlining the children's dream museum.

Ictus

Musicians from Ictus provide an adventurous confrontation between architecture, music and sound. At an intersection, a street musician plays a duet with his boombox. The sound of aluminium rods blends with his voice, saxophone and accordion. Voices sounding in the distances gradually form harmonies. The melody is construed and amplified by the acoustic potential of the large space, but also by your own hearing.

On Saturday 14 September and Saturday 21 September, you can attend a radio broadcast with the collective Le Biais Vert at iMAL. Connecting with MolenFest and the NaturArchy exhibition, the broadcast will examine the link between maledominated societies and ecological disasters. It will be live on Radio Campus and LYL Radio. After the program, you get a guided tour of the exhibition.

NaturArchy investigates issues of ecology, sustainability and the decolonization of nature. The works on display explore the entangled connections between nature and law. the human and non-human, green technologies and new materials, ecology and economy, ancient and new forms of knowledge. The exhibition moves from oceans to water flows, from bacteria and pollution to climate tipping points, from natural and artificial intelligence to non-human values and norms, from wonder to collective action.

Fieldworks / Heine Avdal & Yukiko Shinozaki

A group of dancers and performers sally forth. Like traveling sculptures they tour the city, crossing the bridges of the canal. They move along different paths, through different landscapes, in one fluid and sustained performance that has no beginning or end. They adapt to different situations, settings and contexts along the way, constantly interacting with their surroundings. Using paper and textiles and their own bodies, they measure and produce frames that highlight the features or scale of the landscape, creating alternative interpretations of the link between the (human) body and time, between space and the environment.

With their company fieldworks, Heine Avdal and Yukiko Shinozaki Avdal have made numerous productions that toured internationally. Their work focuses on "performativity" and on the open interpretation of movement through different media.

Valley Walk and Future Places Architecture Workroom Brussels

Nature is a hidden reality in many places in Brussels and largely absent in Molenbeek, which nevertheless owes its name to it. Place names such as "Étangs Noirs" and "Beekkant" betray the historical presence of brooks and ponds in this highly urbanized area. Seated among wild plants and flowers at Brussels' little-known Park West, we navigate a mysterious path through exquisite photographs, guided by voices and a soundtrack by multiform musicians Ulla and Perila (LOG). Time Based Editions' ingenious new format offers 'audio-visual' as two separate elements, held together in the present through a physical synchronisation of our hands. Their second release is a 'cover version' in both a musical and publishing sense: a new cover is wrapped around someone else's book with a commissioned soundtrack expanding its contents. Under the cover is ADE DEA, published by Gli Ori: a 'twilight magic herbarium" by Milan-based Sara Rossi, whose photographs testify to a decade of sunset encounters at the city's edge

LOG are Ulla and Perila, each known for their influential and varied output on labels such as Motion Ward and West Mineral. And can you commit to a cause in the city if you're on temporary disability?

During this networking day for stakeholders in the cultural field, we will figure out these questions and talk about how inclusive we can (really) be.

In the wake of the *How to OMTA* (Open Meeting space for Temporary Art) project and the creation of its culture committee, Cultureghem has set up a learning network with the help of Demos. Together with other cultural organizations who want to democratize their programming, we will discuss our respective work processes, how we each redistribute power, where we differ and clash, and so on.

We follow a protagonist on her train journey through Belgium, having intriguing encounters along the way. Her personal story is interwoven with that of her relatives, living in the Occupied Palestinian Territory. STILL HERE: An Alliance with the SZenne River

For three years, Natural Contract Lab (NCL) has been walking with* the SZenne and its communities of people, fish, trees and living clay. They do this to strengthen their connection to the landscape and call attention to the rights of the river. NCL weaves a thread through the histories and memories of the SZenne and its inhabitants, connecting everything into one inseparable ecosystem. In recent months, NCL walked with the river from its source in Naast to the Zennegat in Mechelen. Following the rhythms of the water and the surrounding land, the participants created space for togetherness and mutual care. In the next walking-with, the lab will use soundscapes and stories that bear witness to the communal flow of the SZenne: sometimes invisible and underground, but always unique and inextricably linked to Brussels. In this way, the group hopes to restore the river to its rightful and natural course.

*What exactly is the art of walking-with? Walking-with is a site-specific conversation, an interactive and dynamic tale that engages the senses and the imagination, an ongoing exchange of memories, experiences and shared grief. The participants want to listen to the water, but also think about new and improved ways of caring for the river, which has suffered much ecological damage. As such, these mobile gatherings aim to forge a care alliance for the SZenne that enshrines the rights of the river and its biodiverse populations into a living law.



This cheerful moment is part of a longer trajectory that Brussels-based artist Anna Rispoli is co-facilitating together with local and international collectives of women who migrated, with and without papers and their sisterhood organisations. Whether in their families, or those of their employers, whether paid or unpaid, women are required to provide care labour for the elderly, children and the house. And this labour is often



called "love". For women who migrated, this caring bond is also the required condition to acquire legal residence, to the point where it becomes a threatening ambiguity. The aim of this empowering gathering is to reclaim the terrain of love as a ground for nurturing oneself, sisterhood and political debate, thus creating a way to converge into a powerful collective body and joyfully engage in the struggle for regularisation and a more just society for everybody. With love not for love, which is chaotically unfolding on the bridge at Porte de Flandre on the occasion of MolenFest, is a first blueprint for a potential bigger event that will emerge from this 2-year trajectory.

The Practice of Democracy / An analogue Campaign (2019 -2021) (on the practice of public speaking, 2019)

Unexpected speeches are delivered at various meeting places in Brussels. But this time the speakers are not politicians, but young city dwellers. During a six-day workshop, they have worked on their own speech about politics and social coexistence. What could this mean for our democratic system and the way we live together? How do we organize ourselves, or make joint decisions? What do we want to decide together? These questions are the premise for stories by young people from Brussels about how they see society.

Today, superficial digital forms of civic engagement have increasingly become the norm. *An Analogue Campaign* bucks this trend and returns to the physical space and word-of-mouth context of the public forum. Speakers address their fellow citizens directly, sharing their concerns and opening themselves up to unexpected encounters in the public sphere.
